WHEN LAST WE SPOKE

- The lawyers for the petitioners, who are arguing in support of same-sex marriage, had until February 27 to file their briefs with the Court.
- The states involved had until March 27 to file their briefs that support the argument that their state measures against same-sex marriages are constitutional.
- \bullet $\,$ Final legal briefs were due on Friday April 17 at 2:00 p.m.
- $\bullet \qquad \text{SCOTUS heard oral arguments at the end of April.}$
- \bullet $\,\,$ SCOTUS decision is expected in late June.
- And on June 26, 2015, Obergefell v. Hodges (in a 5-4 decision) held that the fundamental right to marry is guaranteed to same-sex couples by both the Due Process Clause and the Equal Protection Clause of the 14th Amendment.
